2. Office of National Statistics (ONS)

From the website: <http://geoportal.statistics.gov.uk> click on “boundaries”, then “administrative boundaries”, next “parishes and non-civil parished areas”, then “2016 boundaries” and finally “parishes and non-civil parished areas (Dec 2016) full extent boundaries in England and Wales.” On the bottom right-hand side under a title “About”, click on “create web map” and put specific parish in the search box at the top. 3. South Lakeland District Council (SLDC)

SLDC has an online mapping system, where parish boundaries can be viewed at different scales.
